

- 2) connecting to health and social services, and
- 3) providing cultural connection via one-on-one care plan development and navigation.

Plan for CHW services for refugees and humanitarian immigrants within PHSKC

- PHSKC contracted with 25 community navigators during COVID-19 pandemic to educate and represent diverse communities, reduce barriers to services.
- Community navigators now provide a variety of education and outreach services to programs throughout PHSKC.
- Includes people who are from and / or speak languages of:

Eritrea Iran



CHW services for refugees from Ukraine



- Organizations can partner or subcontract, but lead must submit application.
- Period from October 1, 2024, to September 30, 2026.
- Applicants must demonstrate success in proposed services and the capacity to provide services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate.
- Clients must be ORR eligible and include services to both adults and children.



Organizations must:

- 1. Have an established Community Health Worker (CHW) program. A "CHW" is frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of a community or who has a thorough understanding of the community being served. CHW is an umbrella term for many job titles and duties including, but not limited to care coordinator, health educator, community specialist, outreach coordinator, community advocate, promotora, case manager, and family aid.
- 2. Be able to commit to up to 24 months of partnership (October 2024 through September 2026) with PHSKC.
- 3. Have ties to and experience providing culturally appropriate services to the Ukrainian community.
- 4. Be able to meet the fiscal and administrative requirements to manage federal grants.

Proposals

Must include:

- administrative duties
- at least one or more of the following areas
 - Health Education: targeted individual (one-on-one)
 - Health Education: targeted group education (3 participants or more)
- Health Navigation: Mental health and/or health related services (short term/1 time connection to services)
- Health Navigation: Health related services (ongoing service/care coordination)

Can include:

- Supplemental Activity: Community-led Spaces.
- Outreach and engagement to facilitate and/or participate in community-led spaces promoting social connection, health and wellness and promotion of contracted services.



Services provided by this award must:

- Complement, not duplicate, any other Office of Refugee Resettlement funded activities.
- Not replace services provided under other federal programs (e.g., Medicaid, Reception and Placement, CDC) or ORR funded sources (e.g., Cash and Medical Assistance including Refugee Medical Screening, and Preferred Communities).
- Include creative and innovative approaches to provide health resources and education to the Ukrainian refugee population.
- Be client-centered, trauma-informed, and strengths-based. Outcomes should be specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound (SMART).
