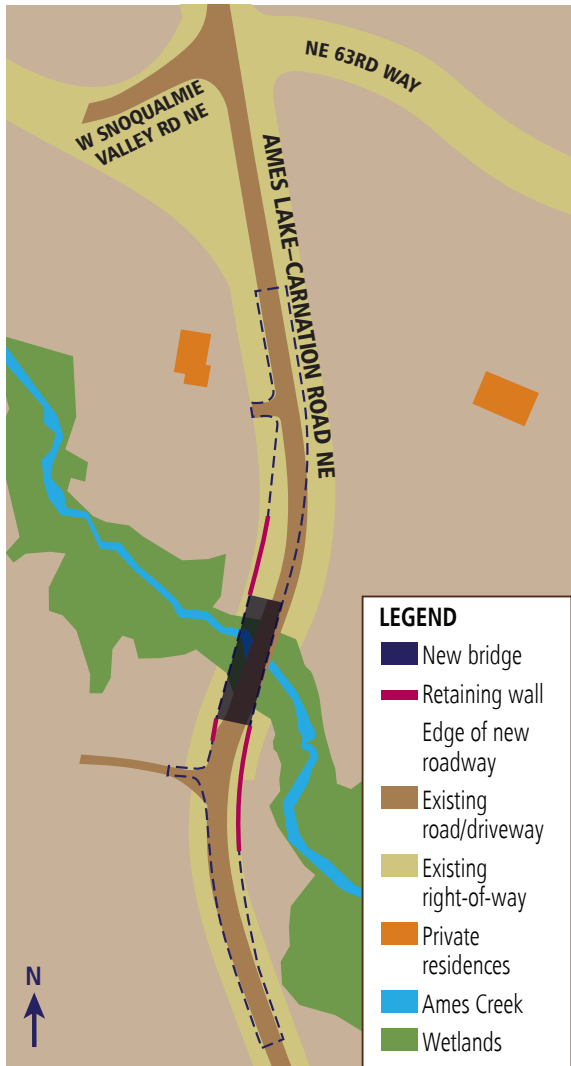

Project overview

King County will replace the 100-year-old **Ames Lake Trestle Bridge** in 2024 and 2025.



Current bridge approach. The new bridge will not have vehicle weight restrictions.



The new bridge will straighten out the roadway to increase sight-lines and safety.

What to expect during construction

- ▶ The work will take approximately eight (8) months. During construction, Ames Lake-Carnation Road NE, between W. Snoqualmie Valley Road NE and NE 52nd Street, will be closed at the bridge location.
- ▶ All traffic, including emergency vehicles and school buses, **must follow an alternate route** during the eight-month construction period.

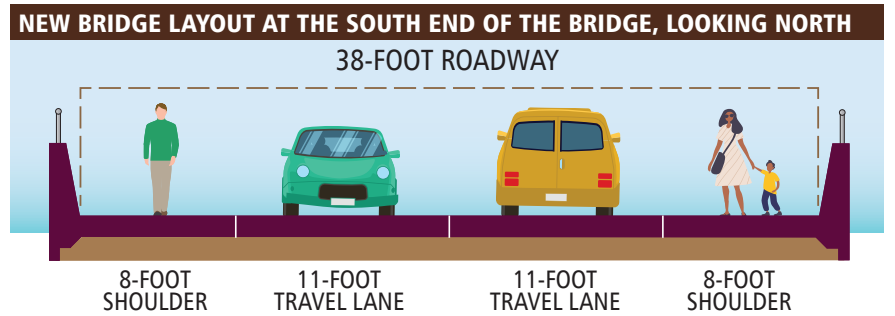
Why is King County replacing this bridge?

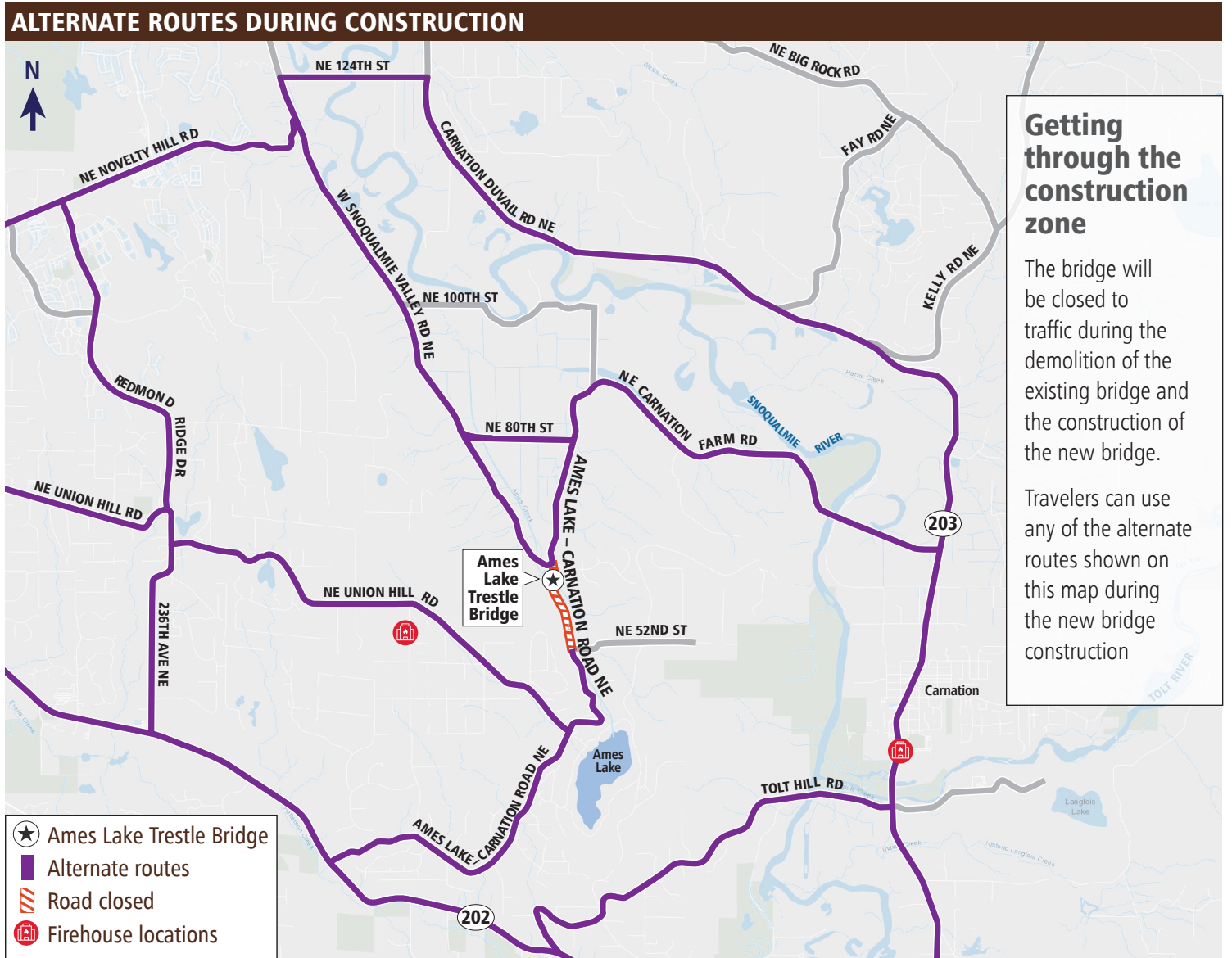
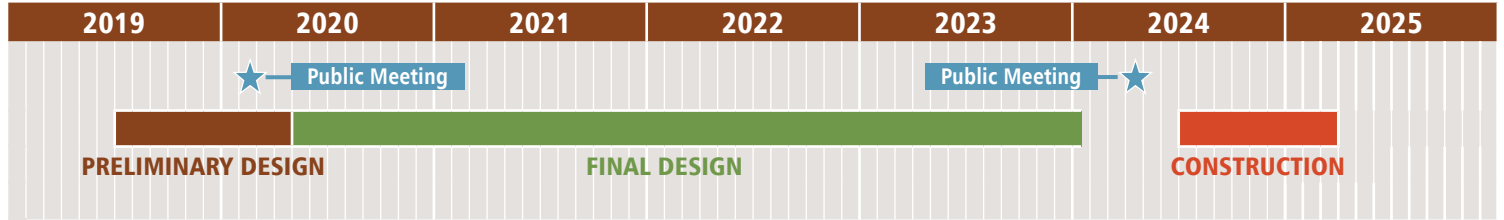

Project schedule

King County has completed the design process for the replacement bridge, final design, right-of-way acquisition and environmental permitting. Construction is planned to start in June 2024 and is anticipated to be complete in March 2025.
